


Using an AED on Children and Infants

You must identify if the patient is under cardiac arrest or not. Check if they have:

- Collapsed
- Lost consciousness
- Are not breathing
- Have no pulse

When there is no other rescuer beside you, the situation can turn worse without using AEDs timely on patients who are infants or children.


Consider the AED Pads position below and save a child's life.



Using AED pads for infants and children should be clear from these images.

Once the pads are set, the AED will detect if the shock is needed on the patient.

Then, you would have to press the button on the AED to deliver the defibrillation shock to the infant or child who is suffering from cardiac arrest.



The AED will give audio instruction to perform CPR, and then it checks the analysis of the patient again after 2 minutes.
